- Over 1,300 students ride our 36 school buses every day





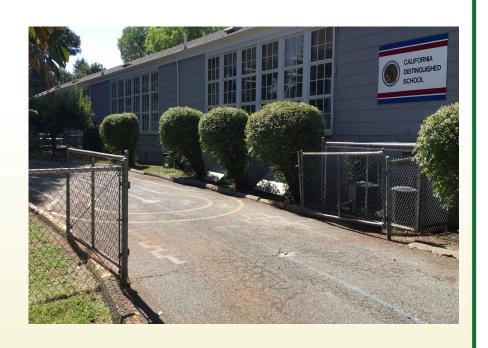

Local Funding for Local Schools

- At PUSD, we strive to maintain a safe and up-to-date educational environment
- The Board of Trustees is considering a \$53 million facility improvement bond to repair and update our schools
- This measure could be placed on the November 2018 ballot





Local Funding for Local Schools

If approved by voters, the measure would:

- Repair or replace leaky roofs, deteriorating plumbing and aging septic systems
- Upgrade inadequate electrical and security systems
- Replace outdated heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems
- Improve student access to computers and modern technology
- Construct and modernize science labs and classrooms
- Update physical education facilities for school and community use

PARADIS Local Funding for ALL Local Schools

- The Facilities Bond would provide for **ALL** public school students on the Ridge.
- Public Charter School students will also benefit from this Bond.
- Current law allows PUSD to include all Ridge students when allocating funds for movable assets. All assets are owned by PUSD and can not be permanently installed on non PUSD owned property.
- The PUSD Master Plan is allocating \$5,676,000 (10.71%) of the \$53M Facilities Bond to "Movable Assets."

Strict Fiscal Accountability

- All funding would stay local to support Paradise and Magalia schools and could never be taken by the State
- No funds could be used for administrators' or staff salaries or pensions
- A Citizens' Oversight Committee and independent audits would be required to ensure all funds are spent as required
- This measure would cost property owners no more than \$57.50 per \$100,000 in **assessed** (not market) value per year
- Average assessed home value on the Ridge is \$165,744 = \$7.94/month

Priority 2: Safety Code and health improvements at all remaining campuses (roofing, painting, HVAC, asphalt repair, etc.), begin 21st century classroom improvements at all campuses, new and modernized facilities at Paradise ES, develop additional robust CTE programs at Paradise HS

Priority 3: Complete 21st century classroom improvements at all campuses, create equity amongst STEAM and learning commons at all campuses

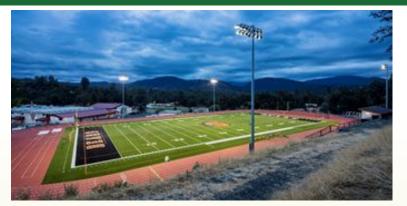
